Secretary's Report

Amarillo Railroad Museum Business Meeting November 4, 1999, Western Plaza

President Michels called the meeting to order at 7:59 PM. There were16 members present. President Michels asked if there were any corrections to the minutes of the last meeting as published in Run 8. There being none, the minutes stand approved as published.

President Michels called for the Treasurer's report. Treasurer Smith reported the following for the month of October:

The Roberts Street property is sold and the club has \$4,326.55 added to its treasury. The treasurer's report was approved as read.

The helium car donated to the Amarillo Railroad Museum was sent to Amarillo by mistake. The car, number NHAX 1242, is sitting in the Amarillo yard. Member Tom Jones talked with the yardmaster Earl Crow. Earl said that the brake system on our car is obsolete and they cannot move it out of the yard in its present condition. He also said that several other cars, slated for Edwards Air Force Base, will have to be repaired before those cars can be sent. Another possibility is for the club to hire a truck with a heavy-duty trailer, and have the car transported to our site at the old air base. President Michels had talked with Jeff Ford, president of TPRHS, about working in cooperation to have both of the helium cars moved to Amarillo. President Michels does not know what effect the latest developments will have.

The 1962 PFE paint scheme kits are in. These kits have the billboard lettering to the right of the side doors. It is not clear when the 1960s Northern Pacific scheme kits will arrive. It is hoped that they will be here before the Oklahoma City Train Show. President Michels said that a billboard scheme kit had been sent to Dick Bale, Editor of Rail Line News, who will report on the car in a later issue. A member reported that the company which publishes Rail Model Journal has been sold. Robert Schleicher, Editor, will remain in his present position.

President Michels called the club's attention to the work schedule posted at the front of the room. He urged members to sign up for at least twenty four hours of work. President Michels said that ads will be placed with newspapers, TV and radio stations. Member Bates said that as a non-profit organization, we could get a free one-week ad on the TCA Cable Advertising Channel. President Michels announced that we would decorate for the Christmas Show at the November 18 Thursday night meeting.

President Michels said that another project the club should undertake is to sort all of the model railroad magazines, set aside one good copy of each month for the club library and box the rest for sale at the Oklahoma

City Train Show. He announced that the club will have tables at the Oklahoma City Train Show for selling PFE cars and, hopefully, Northern Pacific reefers. Model railroad magazines would fit right in.

There was some mention of buildings and rolling stock for the raffle layout. Director Sowle pointed out that all cars should be 40 foot or shorter since the curve radius is so small. The club will add two or three of the cement cars.

President Michels praised the Lockheed-Martin model railroad club's layout and said that we could schedule a visit some weekend. The Trinity Industries tour might also be included. He said that April would be a good month to schedule these visits.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:37 PM.
